
Message from the Committee - Round 12, 2022

Round 10 19/6/2022 Opposition - Monbulk

A wet week on the training track saw ten committed players work on their defensive skills. This week's game was against a finals contender, this time against Monbulk. With more players available than we have had for a while, confidence was high. We took to the field with 15 players and another four from the under 10s came along at quarter time to take up their spots.

The first quarter saw a lot of pack footy. So many players all surrounding the ball, it was hard to get our game going. Every time we got hold of the ball, we were under pressure and it took quite a while to adjust to this style of footy, on a much larger ground. Archie was doing a great job in defence early on, ensuring that any opposition forward moves were sent back the other way. Ollie and Jack were drawing on all their stamina and picking up their share of the footy in both attack and defence. In the second quarter, Saxon went into the ruck and gave the other onballers some opportunities to get their hands on the ball. However, with so many players returning from illness and not having played for a while, the lack of stamina was evident. To the player's credit, their effort and willingness to go after the footy remained.

Going into the last quarter, we found ourselves behind on the scoreboard and with five minutes to go, we were 8 points behind, having only kicked two goals for the game. The ball lived in our forward line and we managed to scramble two points. A kick out from the opposition, along with a great deal of forward pressure resulted in Connor L gathering from 30 metres out, brushing off an opponent and kicking a goal to tie the game with 1 minute 30 left on the clock. Connor then went into the middle to contest the ruck. He put the ball into Ollie's path who, under pressure, got some great distance into his kick. Syd and his opponent battled for it with Syd gaining a metre's space, picking it up cleanly, steadying and kicking a goal from 20 metres out. We had hit the front. 30 seconds on the clock was not enough for Monbulk to get the ball out of the middle and we held on to win a memorable game.

Every player on the ground should be congratulated for their effort and mindset. When we lost to Mt Evelyn earlier in the year, we had dropped our heads when faced with the same situation. Today was a big step for us.



OLINDA FERNY CREEK JUNIOR FOOTBALL CLUB POLICIES:

- OFCJFC players, parents, coaches, spectators, officials & administrators are to abide by the Codes of Conduct detailed in the By-Laws of the Outer Eastern Football League.
- The club and OEFL have a non-smoking policy. Smoking is not permitted inside the perimeter of the playing arena or inside the clubrooms or the undercover area outside the canteen.
- All membership dues must be paid in full before a player takes the field. This includes training.
- Players giving away 30 or 50 metre penalties shall be substituted immediately by the coaching staff (at their discretion).
- Umpires are not to be questioned or approached on game day.
- Mouthguards are compulsory during games. They are highly recommended for training sessions.
- The OFCJFC has in place an approved Covid Safety Plan that is available upon request.
- The club encourages development of players, coaches and officials. All coaches are asked to enrol in a Level 1 AFL accreditation course, which will be paid for by the club. Similarly, trainers are encouraged to enrol in sports trainer's courses, which the club will pay for.
- The club requires the following positions filled each year to operate: President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, Canteen Manager, Sponsorship Manager, Website Co-ordinator, Registration Secretary, Risk Management Officer, Footy Record Co-ordinator, Public Officer, League Delegate, Social Secretary, Property Steward, General Committee.

2017 Tobacco Reforms - Smoking is off the menu!

From 1 August 2017, changes to the *Tobacco Act 1987* will mean that smoking is banned at all Victorian commercial outdoor dining areas when food is available for consumption.

The smoking ban includes:

- premises such as restaurants, cafés, take-away shops and licensed premises, including courtyard dining areas and footpath dining;
- food fairs; and

• within 10-metres of a food stall or vendor at other organised outdoor events, including community or street festivals.

Smoking will also be banned in an outdoor drinking area if any part of that area is within 4-metres of an outdoor dining area, unless separated by a wall of at least 2.1-metres high.
